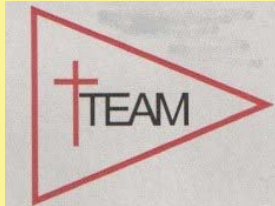

Jen's Mexicorn Dip

Ingredients:

2 cans (11 oz. can) mexicorn, drained
 1 can (4 oz. can) chopped green chilies
 1 whole bell pepper, chopped
 3 whole green onions, chopped
 2 whole jalapenos, chopped (without seeds)
 8 ounces shredded cheddar cheese
 1 cup sour cream
 1 cup mayonnaise

Directions:

Combine all ingredients.
 Chill before serving with Fritos!

Easy Cheesy Hot Bean Dip

Ingredients:

1 (8 oz.) block of cream cheese, softened
 1 (15.5 oz.) can of Bushes Chili Starter Beans
 1 jar of salsa (8-12 oz.)
 1 1/2 cups grated cheese of choice
 (Cheddar, Colby Jack, etc....)

Directions:

Preheat oven to 350°. Spray a 9 inch pie plate (or any equal sized oven safe dish) with non-stick cooking spray. Spread the cream cheese evenly in the bottom of the dish. Next, using the lid of the can, gently drain of the liquid from the beans (do not rinse), and then evenly spread on top of the cream cheese. Pour salsa on top of the beans, using just enough to cover them (about 8-10 oz.). Place into preheated oven and bake for 30 minutes until the edges begin to bubble. Remove from oven; add the shredded cheese (enough to cover the salsa). Place back into oven just long enough to melt the cheese (about 5-8 more minutes). Remove from oven and serve with tortilla chips.

Baked Parmesan Potatoes

Ingredients:

4 medium red potatoes (cubed)
 3-4 tablespoons of olive oil
 2 tablespoons dry ranch salad dressing mix
 1/2 cup parmesan cheese
 1 tsp. salt
 dash of garlic pepper

Directions:

Cube the potatoes.

Place in a ziploc bag with oil and shake to coat potatoes.

Add ranch dressing mix and parmesan and shake again until well coated.

Line a baking sheet with aluminum foil and spray with cooking spray.

Place coated potatoes on the baking sheet and sprinkle with salt and garlic pepper.

Bake at 400 for 25-30 minutes.

Mexican Salad

Ingredients:

1 pkg. (16 oz.) iceberg lettuce or romaine
(torn into pieces)
1 can (15.5 oz.) black beans, rinsed
4 tomatoes, chopped
1 cup thick & chunky salsa
1/2 cup sour cream
1 cup shredded Colby and Monterey Jack
cheeses
2 green onions, sliced
2 cups broken tortilla chips

Directions:

Layer lettuce, beans, and tomatoes in large bowl.

Mix salsa and sour cream until blended; spread over salad to edge of bowl.

Sprinkle with cheese and onions.

Refrigerate several hours.

Sprinkle with chips just before serving; toss lightly.

Lemon Pudding Cookies

Ingredients:

1 cup buttermilk baking mix (I used Bisquick)
1 (3 ounce) package instant lemon pudding mix
1 egg
1/4 cup vegetable oil
1/3 cup granulated sugar (I used powdered sugar)

Directions:

Preheat oven to 350; grease 2 large cookie sheets (I didn't; I used parchment paper).

Mix baking mix, pudding, egg, and oil in a large bowl until dough forms.

Roll dough into approximately 1 inch balls. Put them two inches apart on cookie sheets.

Dip flat bottom glass into sugar. Press onto dough ball and flatten into 1/4 inch thick cookie.

Bake until just golden brown on the edges (approx. 10 minutes).

Transfer to racks and cool completely.

Makes 12 – 14 cookies, depending on how big you make them.
